

Graham as Indian Agent, Piapot once asserted: "Now I know the Government is going to break the Treaty because when it was signed it was understood that it would last as long as the grass grew, the winds blew, the rivers ran, and men walked on two legs, and now they have sent us an Agent who has only one leg.
