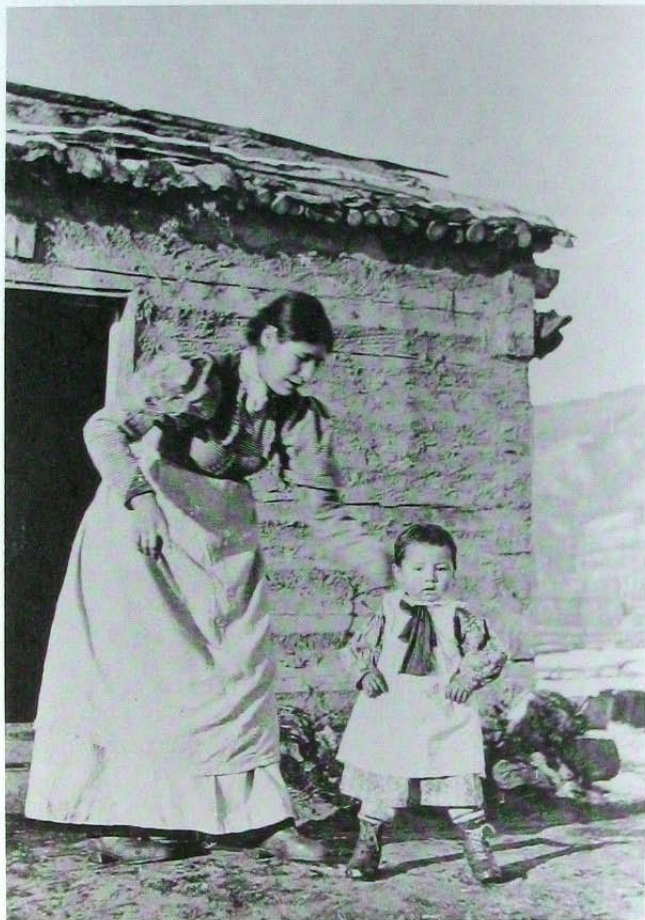

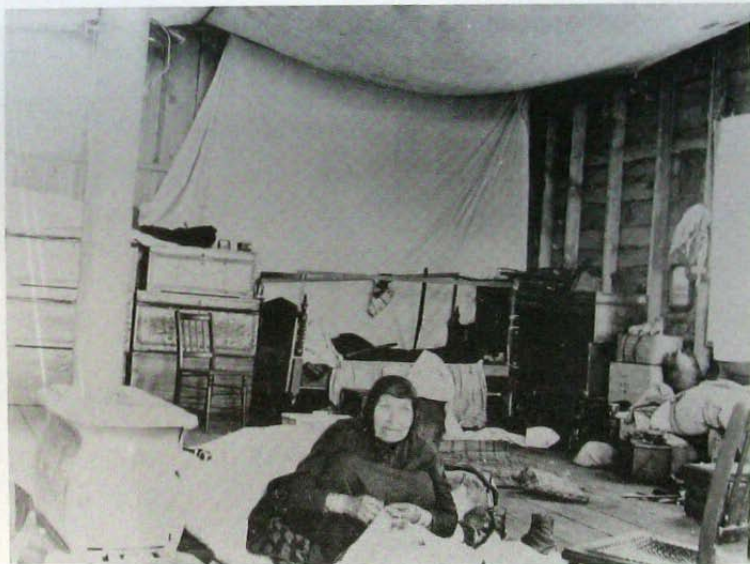


Plate 2: "Interior of Indian Cabin—Wrangle, British Columbia, 1897–1898."

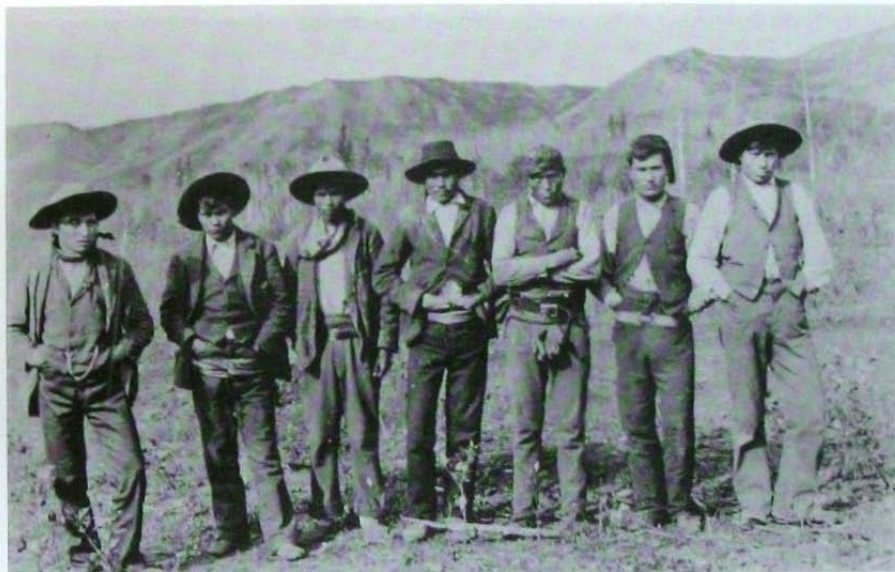
