To be eligible, your paper has to be accepted in the program before the ISIK conference commences, be fully drafted and submitted to the Awards Committee at the conference, redrafted after the conference if required, and then submitted to the review process for publication in AJIE. \$750 and the AJIE subscription will be presented at the conference dinner, and the remaining \$750 will be distributed when the paper is accepted for publication by AJIE. The Best Paper Award will be judged by an Awards Committee, and the committee members will include Hosts of each*
